Kingdom Musings: Grace Notes from Our Pastor- May 2025 The Holy Spirit – Living in Resurrection Power

As we move forward from the joy of Easter, reflecting on the power of Christ's resurrection, we naturally turn to the promised gift of Pentecost- the Holy Spirit. It is through the Spirit that we are empowered to live in the fullness of Christ's victory, walking in faith and glorifying God through our lives.

The Holy Spirit is central to our faith, fulfilling Jesus' promise in John 14:16–17: "And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Advocate to help you and be with you forever - the Spirit of truth."

What does it mean to live in the Spirit's power? Firstly, it means being led by the Spirit. Romans 8:14 reminds us, "For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God." Living in step with the Spirit calls us to trust God's guidance in all areas of our lives, seeking His wisdom and discernment each day.

Secondly, it means living with boldness and courage. After the Holy Spirit descended at Pentecost, the apostles proclaimed the Gospel with fearless conviction,

transforming lives and bringing people into God's Kingdom. That same Spirit equips us today to share our faith and live confidently, even when faced with challenges.

Finally, it means being unified in the Spirit. Ephesians 4:3- 4 encourages us to "make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit." The Holy Spirit binds us together as one body in Christ, breaking down barriers of division and calling us to live in harmony with one another. Through the Spirit, we are empowered to build bridges of love, forgiveness, and understanding in a world that desperately needs them.

As we enter this season of Pentecost, let us invite the Holy Spirit to renew us and empower us afresh. May we live boldly in resurrection power, embracing the Spirit's guidance and fostering unity that glorifies God in our lives and communities. Together, let us pray: "Come, Holy Spirit, renew us and lead us." Shalom in Christ.

Jan and Trevor also continue their pastoral prayer ministry for our fellowship and will be


